Plan A	Non – emergency Low Risk	Engages well with others Answers questions clearly Follows instructions well Behaviourally organised Generally in control of emotions No history of problem behaviour on site Has the support of Supervisors Has support of other workers Able to articulate travel plans Able to clearly articulate expectations	Talk to your supervisor
	Non – emergency Medium Risk	Low level of engagement with others Adequately follow instructions Has some problems answering questions Has minor behavioural disorganisation Generally compliant Exhibits some agitation and distress No history of problem behaviour Has the support of supervisors and peers May require assistance (reminders) in articulating travel plans and expectations No risk factors evident	Talk to your supervisor
Plan B	High Risk Evacuation	Has a low or no engagement with others Does not follow instructions Cannot or does not respond to questions Is behaviourally disorganised Exhibits distorted, delusional or hallucinatory thinking Has a history of problem behaviour Cannot be left without supervision or monitoring Unable to articulate travel plans Unable to articulate future expectations Overtly threatens harm to self or others Mental state may be compromised by alcohol, drugs or medication.	You need to consider leaving site
Plan C	Critical Incident	The individual may be experiencing all or some of the above mentioned as well as: Chronic Anxiety Extremely emotional Physical stress such as: chest pains, nail biting, rocking, pale, cold, clammy skin, confused, unfocused, stuttering, not making sense Determine urgency Determine appropriate destination Engage Occupation Physician assessment Engage EAP/Psychologist assessment Plan transport options	Fly out
